## Extracurricular Activities

The extracurricular activity, serving as a complement to the academic experience, is an integral part of the holistic education. Based on the University's ideals — Truth, Goodness, Beauty, and Holiness, and the University's mission to foster community awareness and a spirit of service, Fu Jen University supports and plans various intramural activities such as Freshman Orientation, University Games, Campus Fair, Ceremony for Veneration of Ancestors, Commencement Ceremonies, Student Organization Exhibition, University Anniversary celebrations in December, Arts and Humanities Month in March, Election Month in May, end-of-semester Student Organization Exhibitions, and Leadership Development Camp. Through the diverse programs and activities, the University strives to provide its students an environment, which cultivates balanced development of self and community.

For student governance, there are the Student Union, nine College Student Associations, and forty-four Department Student Associations. There are over ninety registered student organizations, which include academic and fine-art organizations; service and coordinating clubs; and sports and recreational activity groups. These voluntary student organizations provide opportunities for individuals to recognize their own competences, develop professional skills, share common interests with other students, learn the dynamics of group activity, and gain a robust out-of-the-classroom learning experience.

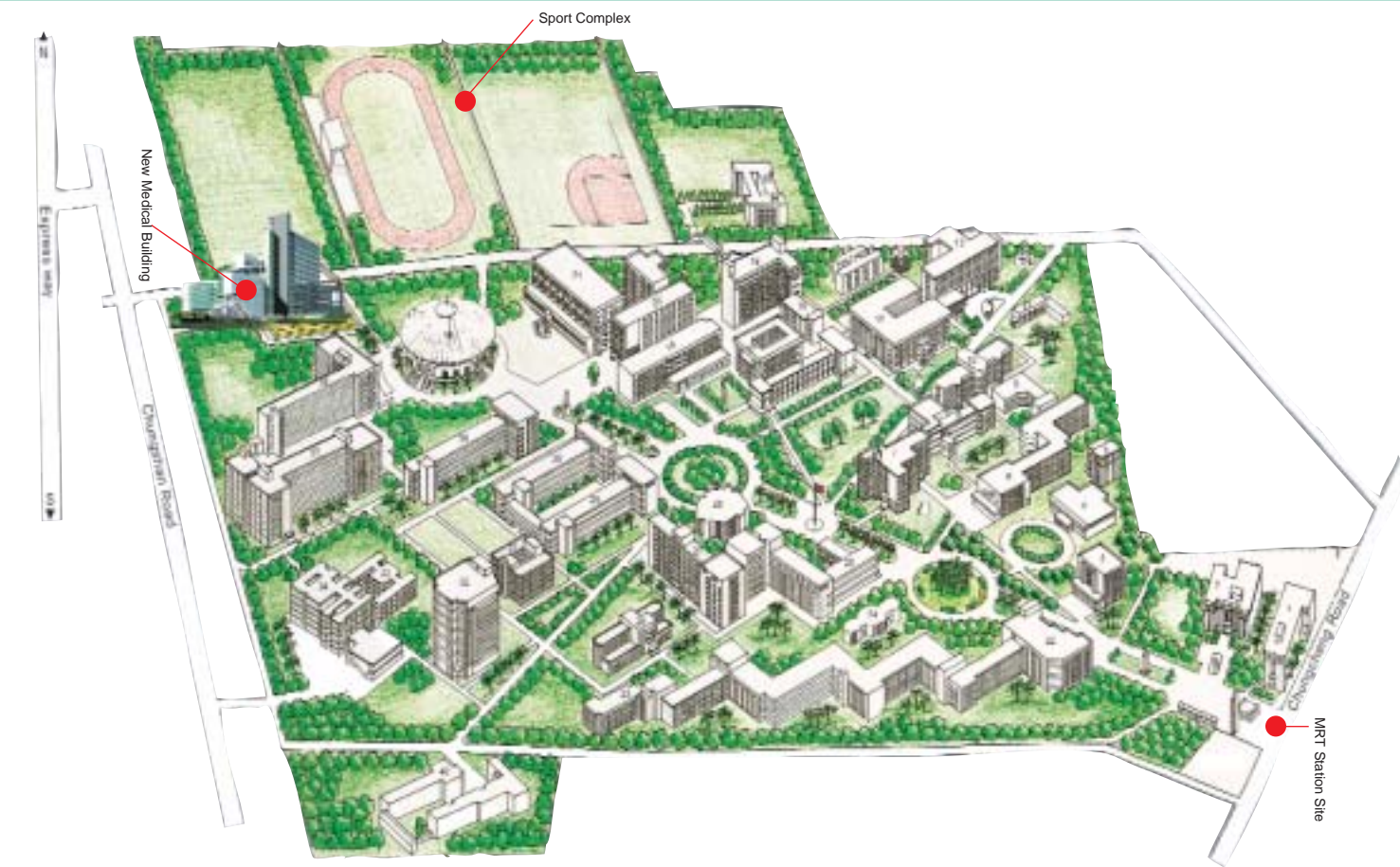

Highway. The school can be easily reached by public buses. In the future, the Hsinchuang Line of the Mass Rapid Transit System will make a stop at Fu Jen, thus make the transportation network more convenient.

# History

Fu Jen Catholic University was founded in Beijing in 1925 by the Benedictines of St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pennsylvania, USA at the request of the Holy See. It was opened as a single college under the name of Fu Jen Academy. In 1929, the Ministry of Education officially recognized Fu Jen as a University. In 1959, the Chinese Diocesan Clergy, the Society of Jesus, and the Society of the Divine Word collaborated on the reestablishment of the University in Taiwan. In 1960, the Ministry of Education granted permission to restore Fu Jen in Taiwan. In 1961, the Graduate Institute of Philosophy was opened and received students. In 1963, the University was granted a share of the successful candidates of the University Entrance Examination and received the first freshmen of the Colleges of Liberal Arts, Science and Engineering, and Law. Founded in 1925, Fu Jen University has a history of 80 years. During the past four decades, more than 120,000 students have graduated from Fu Jen since its reopening in Taiwan.

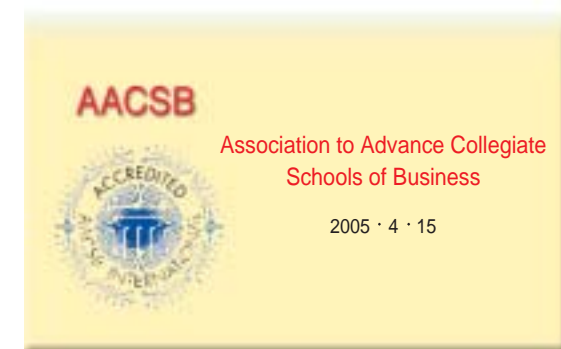
## Faculty Structure

The College of Management at Fu Jen Catholic University has been ratified accreditation by the renowned AACSB (An Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business) International on April 15, 2005, which is a strong endorsement of the quality education of Fu Jen.



## Sister-School Relationship

- To stimulate international academic exchange and collaboration, the University has established sister-school relationships with 104 universities in Canada, France, Japan, Korea, Spain, the United Kingdom, and the United States.
- There are about 90 Fu Jen students participating in the exchange program every year. Fu Jen also receives about 20 exchange students from other countries annually.
- The University provides "Fu Jen Elite Overseas Scholarship" to encourage Fu Jen students to study abroad and to attract international students.
- Fu Jen is the first university that offers exclusive English courses for exchange students and assists these students to assimilate international to Fu Jen's campus life through the tutoring and schoolmate systems.

## International Academic Collaboration

In addition to faculty and student exchange programs, conferences and study visits, the University further implements a GEMBA program in collaboration with the University of Hawaii, an EMBA program in Information Management in collaboration with the University of Detroit, a distance-learning program in collaboration with Knowledge Systems Institute in the United States, and a Joint Degree Program in EMBA in collaboration with Hanxing Academy of Journalism & Communication in Malaysia.

## Overseas Chinese Students

There are about 600 hundred overseas Chinese students from 28 different countries and districts, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Japan, Korea, Macau, Malaysia, Myanmar, Singapore, South Africa, Thailand, the United States and Venezuela. There are also about 100 foreign students from 17 countries, including Honduras, Japan, Korea, Panama, Spain and the United States.

## The Language Center

The Language Center offers courses in Mandarin Chinese. There are about 700 foreign students enrolled every year.



The Fu Jen Computer and Information Center is equipped with 15 computer labs, housing 800 PCs, scanners, printers, and other facilities available for faculty and students. In addition, there are computers in each department's student association to provide on-line services.

- Develop services that provide students, faculty and staff with remote dial-up and on-campus access on the basis of a "single sign on" authentication to the campus backbone network and campus computing resources.
- Provide an integrated system for e-administration.



## Portal to the World of Knowledge

The University Library provides general and specialized collections, services and other resources to support teaching, learning and research. It houses more than one million books, some six thousand journals, more than ten thousand digital journals, more than 60 electronic databases, and more than 40,000 multimedia materials.

There are five locations in the university library system, which are home to collections on social sciences, liberal arts, natural science, medicine, theology respectively.

With the renovation of the Liberal Arts Library and the newly opened Medical Library, library space will exceed more than eight thousand pings, with more than 26 thousands seats, and more than hundreds of on-line computers for information retrieval.

## Scholarships and financial aids total more than \$250 million dollars, including:

- Funds from tuition revenues, \$93 million
- Departmental scholarships, \$3 million
- Endowments, \$1 million
- Grants, \$16 million
- Subsidy from the Ministry of Education \$138 million

The University offers more than one hundred scholarships to honor students for academic excellence and superior performance in various fields, including Scholarship for Excellent Academic Performance, Scholarship for Excellent Performance in Sports, Cardinal Yu Pin Scholarship, Archbishop Lokuang Scholarship, Kung Xiang-Xi Grant for Academic Excellence, Mr. and Mrs. Liu Qing-Zhang Grant for Academic Excellence, Cardinal Yu Pin Scholarship sponsored by the Association of Overseas Chinese American Catholics, Dr. Xue Kuang-Qian Memorial Scholarship, Professor Wu Zhen-Qun and Professor Zhang Xia-Min Grant, Pope John Paul II Scholarship, Father Louis Chang S.J. Scholarship, as well as other scholarships offered by or affiliated to departments and graduate institutes.

The University also offers more than ten different types of need-based financial aids for students from disadvantaged families and for emergency cases. There are also part-time job opportunities and loan-programs sponsored by different sources.

## Student Loan

Following the regulations of the Ministry of Education, the university provides loans to assist students from lower income families to complete their education. The Student Loan program covers tuition, room and board, books and supplies as well as insurance.

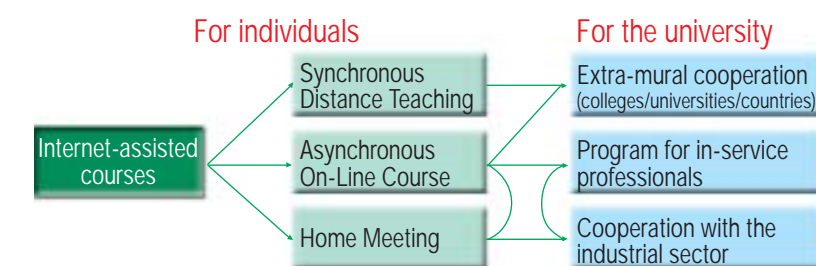
## Holistic Education Curriculum

Fu Jen Catholic University endeavors to provide a "holistic education" experience to foster the potential of students through correlations between curricula and activities with "Holistic Education Curriculum" as its core. The curriculum is composed of three main course groups: "Holistic Education Basics" offers required courses including Introduction to University Life, Philosophy of Life and Professional Ethics; "Language and Culture" aims to sharpen students' language skills and broaden their historical and cultural vision; "General Knowledge" provides students with an opportunity to enrich their knowledge in areas that are not their majors.

## Distance Learning and On-line Teaching

- Starting from 2004, the University collaborated with Knowledge System Institute offering synchronous distance learning courses.
- An on-line teaching portal is established to encourage self-learning.
- A platform for digital learning is provided to accommodate the internet-assisted course materials.
