School Governance

- FJCU ranked 3rd among private universities in a 2021 Global Views Monthly University Prestige Survey, with reviewers being university presidents.
- FJCU was voted the university most favored by employers in a 2021 1111 Job Bank survey, and ranked 5th among all tertiary institutions in Taiwan. In 2020 and 2021, FJCU topped the list for private universities.
- FJCU was awarded the 10th place in 'The Favorite Graduate Students Among Enterprises' category as surveyed by Cheers Magazine in 2020.
- FJCU received a record high subsidy of NT \$113 million from the Higher Education Sprout Project in 2020.
- FJCU was awarded the 1st place in 'The Top University Among Corporations' category among private universities, and the 2nd place in Taipei and New Taipei Districts as ranked by 1111 Job Bank in 2020.
- FJCU was awarded the 9th place nationally and the 2nd place among private universities in the 'The Favorite Graduate Students Among Enterprises' category, as surveyed by the Cheers Magazine in 2019.
- FJCU was awarded the 2nd place nationally and the 4th place in Taipei and New Taipei Districts in 'The Top University Among Corporations' ranking by 1111 Job Bank in 2019. It also had the 1st place among private universities.
- FJCU was awarded the 1st place among private universities in the number of 'Interviews actively offered by companies to graduates' as observed by the 104 Job Bank in 2019
- FJCU was awarded the 10th place in 'The Favorite Graduate Students Among Enterprises' category, the 4th place in Law and Political Science, and the 4th place in Tourism and Leisure as selected by Vision Magazine in 2019.

Evaluation Results

- FJCU's Department of Food Science was the only university in Taiwan to be recognized by the Institute of Food Technologists in 2020 (effective for 5 years from 2020 to 2025).
- All FJCU academic programs received accreditation by the Higher Education Evaluation and Accreditation Council of Taiwan (HEEACT) under the HEEACT Program Accreditation in 2020.
- FJCU's Center for Teacher Education received accreditation by HEEACT's Teacher Education Evaluation in 2020.
- FJCU's Department of Child and Family Studies received accreditation by HEEACT's Preschool Educare Giver Evaluation in 2020.

Academic Research

- Academic research projects (inclusive of MOST projects) number more than 300 each academic year, amounting to more than NT \$200 million in total.
- More than 500 articles are published in notable academic journals each year. In 2020, we had a total of 291 first-authorship articles and 263 corresponding-authorship articles, leading all other private universities.
- FJCU is part of the MOST SPARK Project, and is the only anchor university to participate in the SPARK Project via school-level collaboration.

International Evaluation Results

• FJCU ranked 168th in the Times Higher Education Asia University Rankings 2021.

- FJCU has ranked in the top 100 schools globally for 2 consecutive years (2020 and 2021) in the QS World University Rankings by Subject for Theology, Divinity & Religious Studies, the only school in Taiwan to do so. FJCU also was on the list for Modern Languages (301-320 globally, 8th in Taiwan) and Medicine (501-550 globally, tied for 9th in Taiwan), ranking among the top 10 schools in Taiwan for these 3 categories, surpassing several public universities.
- FJCU ranked in the top 260 schools in the 2021 QS Asia University Rankings.
- FJCU ranked in the top 800 schools globally in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2021.
- FJCU ranked 129th in the THE Emerging Economies University Rankings 2021.

Social Care and Service Learning

• FJCU was on the THE Impact Rankings query of keywords for each SDG (Sustainable Development Goals), and on the Web of Science database, with a total of 873 articles from FJCU published from 2017 to October 2020 that coincided with the goals stipulated by the 17 SDGs. Moreover, more than 420 modules offered by FJCU are aligned with the educational goals proposed by the SDGs.

• FJCU's first foray into the 2020 Taiwan Corporate Sustainability Awards and the University Social Responsibility Sustainability Project Awards (University) resulted in a silver award for both categories.

• Served in the Digital Learning Partner Program Operation Center of the Ministry of Education, and combined with 26 domestic partner universities to serve more than 130 rural elementary and secondary schools

- Recruited nearly 600 university students to serve more than 400 schoolchildren in rural areas and to accompany them online on a one-on-one basis.
- Sponsoring online reading, holiday camps, and providing scholarships for economically disadvantaged students through cooperation with businesses which are willing to share their resources.
- Integrated diversified service learning solutions and designs into professional courses and general education core courses of different departments and introduced these courses into nearly 150 communities and organizations in Taiwan
- Arranged each year for more than 500 volunteer students to go to more than ten rural districts in Taiwan, India, Vietnam, Mongolia, Africa, and so on, to serve and conduct more than 30 volunteer service activities.
- Actively developed a sustainable global partnership relationship, and joined the international service learning program "UNISERVITATE". FJCU is the only university in Taiwan receiving subsidies in this area.





Fu Jen Catholic University Hospital was inaugurated on September 29, 2017. The hospital is the only Catholic university hospital within Chinese society. The hospital demonstrates the tenets of Catholic belief, in respecting nature, loving people and treating patients as their own family. The hospital is dedicated to becoming a medical center in the future.

Fu Jen University Hospital focuses on emergency and intensive care. The medical team is led by senior and well-known doctors. Currently the hospital conducts more than 30 outpatient clinics, 400 outpatient consultations, 50,000 outpatient visits, 4,500 emergency visits, 1,300 operations, and 2,500 hospitalizations per month in its departments of general internal medicine, infectious diseases, cardiology, nephrology, gastroenterology and hepatology, thoracic medicine, metabolism, hematology and oncology, rheumatology and immunology. Surgical clinics are included in the following departments: cardiovascular surgery, general surgery, pediatric surgery, breast surgery, colon and rectal surgery, plastic and reconstructive surgery, thoracic surgery, neurosurgery, urology, and interventional cerebrovascular surgery. Independent departments include obstetrics and gynecology, pediatrics, family medicine, occupational medicine, neurology, orthopedics, otorhinolaryngology, ophthalmology, rehabilitation, anesthesiology, pain, radiation oncology, psychiatry, dermatology, oral and maxillofacial surgery, dentistry, a nutrition consultation clinic and department of nutrition, nuclear medicine, imaging medicine, laboratory medicine, anatomical pathology, emergency medicine, intensive care, pharmacy, nursing and so on, covering a broad-based comprehensive range.

Integrating Professional Skills of Different Departments of the University

The founding concept in healthcare and medical treatment at FJCU hospital is to improve the value of cross-disciplinary learning and introduce innovative designs and thinking to enhance the relevance and competitiveness of student focus and deployment. These include the "Design and Research of Fu Jen Catholic University Hospital's CI Recognition System" by the Department of Applied Arts, the "International Medical Translation Project" by the College of Foreign Languages and Literatures, the "Research, Design and Implementation Project for Fu Jen Catholic University Hospital Uniforms" by the Department of Textiles and Clothing, and the "Development of Low-Residue Diet Meal Packs" by the Department of Nutrition Sciences, as examples in application.

Fu Jen Sports Medical Center

This center combines aspects of the departments of Physical Education, Nutrition Sciences, Food Sciences, Textiles and Clothing, Clinical Psychology, and the Creative Design Center; in addition, with orthopedic sports medical expertise, the Rehabilitation and Physical Therapy departments at the FJCU Hospital develop sports nutrition and supplementary applications, conduct research and development across diverse fields, such as smart clothing, sports psychology applications, 3D printing aids, smart glasses, on-site ultrasound diagnosis, and cardiopulmonary function testing applications thereby integrating the resources of various departments and clinics in the school, so that athletes can receive comprehensive care and dynamic diagnosis, with the aim to enhance treatment, which will be provided effectively at the sidelines of sports fields in the futuree.





School History

Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU) was founded in Beijing in 1925 by the Benedictines of St. Vincent Archabbey (USA). Originally named Fu Jen Academy, it was approved by the Beiyang government in 1927 for its pilot phase, and had its name changed to the current iteration, derived from a phrase in the Analects which reads "The superior man on grounds of culture meets with his friends, and by friendship helps his virtue"(以文會 友,以友輔仁). In 1929, the school applied to the Nationalist government's Ministry of Education to be officially listed as a university. In 1933, the running of the university was handed over to the Society of the Divine Word, and in 1952 a reshuffling of the universities in China resulted in a merger with Beijing Normal University. In 1959, the Chinese Regional Bishops Conference of Taiwan, the Society of the Divine Word, and the Society of Jesus co-managed the re-establishment of the school in Taiwan, and in the following year FJCU received approval from the Education Ministry. In 1961, the Graduate School of Philosophy began recruitment of master students, and in 1963, the university, situated in the Xinzhuang area in then-Taipei County, began officially recruiting undergraduates for its 10 departments in 3 colleges.

Present

Currently, FJCU is comprised of 12 colleges along with the School of Continuing Education (SOCE), including 50 undergraduate departments, 49 master's programs, 23 in-service master's programs, 12 doctoral programs, 18 SOCE departments, as well as one 2-year in-service academic department. We have a total of 435 sister schools globally. The student population stands at nearly 26,000. We have over 12,000 alumni from the Beijing era, and over 220,000 alumni since the school's re-establishment in Taiwan. FJCU is a comprehensive university under the direct authority of the Holy See, with degrees recognized by UNESCO, and has a respected academic standing in Europe and the Americas.

Fu Jen Alumni Associations

Since its re-establishment in Taiwan 60 years ago, the number of FJCU alumni has grown to over 220,000 people. With the encouragement of past FJCU presidents along with the efforts of the various academic departments, there are currently 73 department-level alumni associations. These alumni associations organize events that connect with FJCU alumni all over the world.

To stay connected to FJCU alumni from all areas, there are 47 independent alumni associations all over the world, including: 4 main associations (Fu Jen Worldwide Alumni Association, Fu Jen ROC Alumni Association, Fu Jen North America Alumni Association, and Fu Jen Europe Alumni Association), 9 regional associations in Taiwan, 15 regional associations in the Americas, 7 regional associations in Europe, and 12 regional associations in the Asia Pacific/Australia area. In the future, the university will continue to spur development of alumni associations to act as a bridge between FJCU and its alumni, building connections through the activities and promotion of these associations so as to continue the Fu Jen spirit.

Sister Universities All over the World

FJCU has established sister-school relationships with 435 universities worldwide. More than half of them have entered into agreements for student exchange programs, and nearly 300 oversea students from Europe, America, Asia and Oceania come to FJCU for the exchange program every year. Our students also have the opportunity to select an exchange program from our sister schools around the world. (Statistical data were updated as of August 2021).

Close Communications with the Associations of Catholic and Christian Universities and Colleges

FJCU actively communicates with the member schools of the Association of Christian Universities and Colleges in Asia (ACUCA) and the Association of Southeast and East Asian Catholic Colleges and Universities (ASEACCU). It encourages teachers and students from all departments to actively participate in the annual activities of ACUCA and ASEACCU.

Dual Degree Programs

FJCU has signed 31 dual degree programs with universities across Europe, America, Asia and Oceania including the University of Bayreuth (Germany), Université Catholique de Louvain (Belgium), Temple University (USA), The Catholic University of America (USA), Georgetown University (USA), Oklahoma State University (USA), Renmin University of China (Asia), Iowa State University (USA), Widya Mandala Catholic University (Indonesia), Queensland University of Technology (Australia), University of Ramon Llull (Spain), and Sungkyunkwan University (Korea).

Exchange of International Students – Enhancing Students' International Mobility

To encourage students to study aboard and expand their global view, FJCU also provides scholarships for "Studying in Sister Universities," grants for "Oversea Industrial Internship,"

and related scholarships and grants, in addition to the "Lifting Me Up," "Cherishing Me Like a Pearl" and "Building Dreams" scholarships offered by the Ministry of Education for excellent students to study aboard. In the academic years from 2018 to 2020, a total of 1.014 FJCU students went to our sister universities for exchange, and scholarships were approved for 513 students to study aboard, and the grants were granted to 27 students for oversea internships (Statistical data were updated as of April 2021).

Performance on Counseling Foreign Students

FJCU has continuously received the MOE's honorable mention as an excellent university for counseling foreign students for work, for having excellent personnel and senior personnel, and for taking good care of foreign students. In addition to various scholarships, the Overseas Student Office and the International Student Center also provide life counseling, campus cultural exchange activities and social associations, as well as free Chinese language courses, so that foreign students can gain rich experiences and a sense of belonging.

High-guality Chinese Language Teaching

The Center of Chinese Language and Culture founded in 1964 is the second oldest Chinese language center in Taiwan, and an excellent Chinese language center as assessed by the MOE. The Center has approximately 950 students each year. It provides year-round classes, private classes, professional courses, study tours and other related courses. The Center adopts small classes of 4~7 students to provide high-guality teaching and achieve outstanding learning results.

Fu Jen Global

The Fu Jen Global is a key emphasis in FJCU's efforts vis-à-vis internationalization. It will offer all-English degree programs in the future that attract students and possess a competitive advantage on the international stage. It will also collaborate with the school's EU Center and India Center as well as other programs to offer interdisciplinary modules and courses.

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School Resources

The Center of Information Technology records show that there are 15 computer labs with over 800 computers available on campus, with Wi-Fi coverage available at all education and administrative buildings, the campus food courts, and all public spaces on campus. The school also offers TANet Roaming and Eduroam, giving teachers and students alike the convenience of using their FJCU account to gain access to the Internet at other educational institutes that offer the aforesaid networks as well. All FJCU courses are linked up with TronClass online learning platform, and there is an online English Self-Learning Center, AIEDL courses and other online resources along with campus software downloads provided for FJCU teachers and students. In 2020, FJCU established the Interdisciplinary College and the College of Foreign Languages and Literatures Fr. Franz Giet Building among other facilities as enhanced learning spaces. The school also has a School of Professional and Continuing Education, an Indigenous Students Resource Center, a Campus Ministry Center, a Center for the Arts, a Creative Design Center, and a Student Counselling Center and so forth.

Student Government and Club Activities

FJCU has nearly one hundred student clubs and organizations which are divided into six categories: academic, leisure and social, service, physical fitness, arts, and music. It also has about 80 autonomous organizations distributed in the 12 colleges and continuing education departments. Students can join these clubs freely to learn a variety of knowledge, get together with different types of students, train their communication and cooperation with others, and achieve the ideal of appropriate development.

Support for Underprivileged Students

A budget of approximately 500 to 600 million NT dollars is allocated for the care of underprivileged students in the form of underprivileged student grants, student emergency assistance and compensation, accommodation subsidies for low-income students, aboriginal scholarships, overseas Chinese student scholarships, transportation subsidies and tutoring for special-education students.

Students' On-campus/Off-campus Competitions

Besides basic schoolwork. FJCU also supports students to participate in off-campus competitions, activities, seminars and so forth. Students participating in on-campus or off-campus professional competitions and winning a prize can apply for "a professional competition reward for student achievement and professional competition award." Nearly 1.2 million NT dollars were used for the subsidy of almost 200 students 2018~2020

Students' Career Counseling

A career and vocational help system (CVHS) and a three-stage career counseling mechanism were established to assist students in exploring and planning career development through offering a variety of career information and career activities. Supplemented by the "Internship and job hunting" platform, and "Enterprise recruitment activities," FJCU helps students to transfer from school to workplace smoothly.

FJCU has its own Guizi Sports Center, with a FIFA-approved artificial turf, basketball courts, volleyball courts, badminton courts, an indoor swimming pool, table tennis courts, a sports injury infirmary, a rhythmic center, a judo training hall, a gymnastics center, and a fitness center among other facilities, allowing teachers and students to

FJCU has 7 student dormitories, allowing local and international students as well as teachers to live on campus. The rooms are single, double, 3-person and 4-person, supplied with air-conditionings, study desks, Wi-Fi, wardrobes, individual shower facilities, spin dryers, washing machines (metered service) and other facilities, as well as communal spaces for students to interact with one another. Each dormitory has its own unique facilities. The newly-constructed Yisheng Dormitory (2020) offers an especially attractive living space.

FJCU has the following libraries: the Fahy library, the Kungpo library, as well as the Cardinal Shan library, with over 1 million books, along with hardcopy journals, electronic journals, e-books, an E-Resources database, and audiovisual resources among other resources. There are also learning spaces provided for students in the form of group study areas, personal study rooms, writing centers, a learning commons, a video-recording room, a multimedia production room and so forth. In recent years, the library has greatly enhanced the digital learning framework, providing rich resources for online self-learning courses, while also actively promoting the use of our library resources. The library is also part of library communities such as RapidILL and NDDS, and also has collaborations with libraries from other schools and academic institutions, in turn offering convenient service via these collaborations.
