School logo

The green laurels surrounding the logo symbolize peace, while the 12 stars symbolize the Holy Mother. The Latin words for the school motto (Veritas, Bonitas, Pulchritudo, Sanctitas, 真善美聖) is also seen at the bottom of the logo.



School Flag

The yellow and white colors are similar to the flag of Vatican City, and the word Catholic in the school name symbolize that FJCU is under the direct authority of the Holy See. The 12 stars symbolize the Holy Mother, who watches over the school.

School History

Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU) was founded in Beijing in 1925 by the Benedictines of St. Vincent Archabbey (USA). Originally named Fu Jen Academy, it was approved by the Beiyang government in 1927 for its pilot phase, and had its name changed to the current iteration, derived from a phrase in the Analects which reads "The superior man on grounds of culture meets with his friends, and by friendship helps his virtue" (以文會友，以友輔仁). In 1929, the school applied to the Nationalist government's Ministry of Education to be officially listed as a university. In 1933, the running of the university was handed over to the Society of the Divine Word, and in 1952 a reshuffling of the universities in China resulted in a merger with Beijing Normal University. In 1959, the Chinese Regional Bishops Conference of Taiwan, the Society of the Divine Word, and the Society of Jesus co-managed the re-establishment of the university in Taiwan, and in the following year it received approval from the Ministry of Education. In 1961, the Graduate School of Philosophy began recruitment of master's students; and, in 1963, the university, situated in the Xinzhuang area in then-Taipei County, began officially recruiting undergraduates for its 10 departments in 3 colleges.



Present Situation

Currently, FJCU is comprised of 12 colleges along with the School of Continuing Education (SOCE), including 50 undergraduate departments, 49 master's programs, 23 in-service master's programs, 12 doctoral programs, 18 SOCE departments, as well as one 2-year in-service academic department. We have a total of 435 sister schools globally. The student population stands at nearly 26,000. We have over 12,000 alumni from the Beijing era, and more than 220,000 alumni since the school's re-establishment in Taiwan. FJCU is a comprehensive university under the direct authority of the Holy See, with degrees recognized by UNESCO, and has a respected academic standing in Europe and the Americas.

FJCU is an academic community of students and teachers closely associated in fostering the growth of the whole person, on the basis of Truth, Goodness, Beauty, and Holiness. FJCU is committed to a dialogue leading to the integration of Chinese culture and Christian faith; to academic research and the promotion of genuine knowledge; and to the development of society and the advancement of humankind.

Human Dignity

FJCU affirms human dignity and recognizes all basic human rights, with a special emphasis on freedom of conscience and academic freedom.

Meaning of Life

FJCU promotes search on the meaning of life, the development of an integrated value system, and the pursuit of high moral standards and professional ethics.

FJCU is committed to academic research, to true knowledge and firm action, to the promotion of humanism and to the integration of knowledge.

Community Awareness

FJCU fosters positive interaction between students, staff, faculty, and cultivates a balanced development of self and community.

Dialogue with Cultures

FJCU stresses interaction between Chinese and other cultures, and promotes dialogue between faith and reason.

Religious Cooperation

FJCU offers each individual a context in which to acquire a deeper knowledge of the Christian faith, while fostering interreligious dialogue and collaboration.

Spirit of Service

FJCU seeks to develop a spirit of compassion and service as well as an active commitment to justice with a view to international solidarity.

Overview:

During the Beijing period, FJCU's school logo had a black-and-white circular floral shape, with the characters 輔仁 written inside (picture 1). It then was changed to a dual-colored yellow and purple inverted triangle, again with the characters 輔仁 written inside (picture 2). The colors were arbitrarily chosen.

In 1961, when the school was re-established in Taiwan, the school retained the use of the inverted triangle logo (picture 3), but the colors were changed to white and blue in reference to the colors of Our Lady of Lourdes. In 1970, slight changes were made to the shape to give it a fresh look. In 1971, Reverend Joseph Kung redesigned the logo, showcasing its aesthetics and the meaning behind the logo, and this continues to be used till today.

The green laurels surrounding the logo symbolize peace, while the 12 stars symbolize the Holy Mother who watches over FJCU. The central coat of arms in blue with the characters 輔仁 is the old logo with slight modifications, and the school's name in English, Fu Jen Catholic University, surrounds it. The cross at the top is indicative of the school being a Catholic university, and the characters below 真善美聖 (Truth, Goodness, Beauty, Holiness) are the school motto. The Latin words for the school motto (Veritas, Bonitas, Pulchritudo, Sanctitas) are at the bottom of the logo.

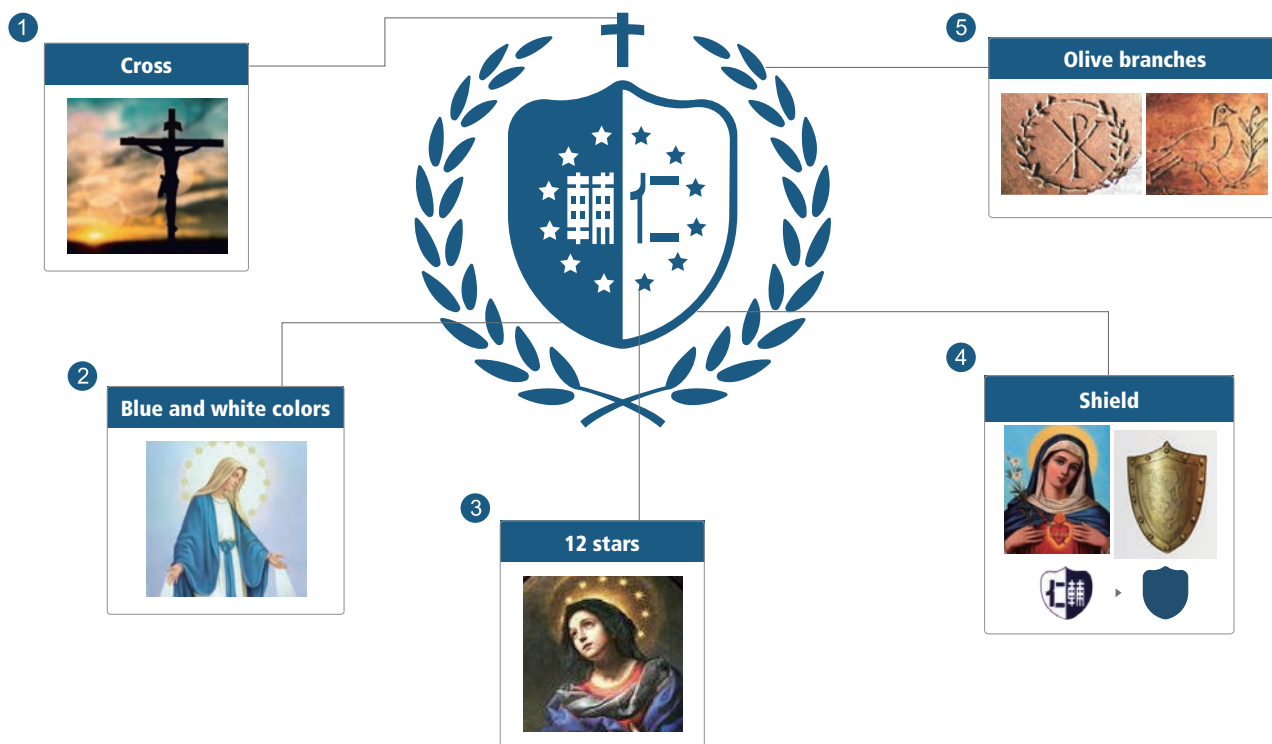
FJCU's New Corporate Identity System (CIS) to Celebrate 60 Years

2021 marks the 60th year since FJCU was re-established in Taiwan, and there is a new strategy with regard to the school's image. This new CIS merges tradition with the future, as FJCU moves forward amidst a multicultural and international age. Be it the transmission of information or of our image, we go beyond history, language, cultural differences, generational differences, in order to create our aesthetic value.

This new FJCU CIS aims to be in line with current trends, moving forward with the times. Through a survey and review of over 600 different designs, it was finally decided to retain FJCU's rich history (such as the shield motif and the words 輔仁) while making modifications and adding a new touch to the shield design. A team led by Prof. Peter Feng, Dean of the College of Art, designed a unique shield without any sharp edges (symbolizing gentleness, peace, and love). It has become a strong iconic image of FJCU, which, as Prof. Feng believes, is an absolute necessity for any major brand. The new image will be employed concurrently with the 1971 school logo.

As FJCU President Chiang Han-sun states, "We hope that the everyone can see the school in light of its brand-new identity, its new vibrancy and new creativity, which brings it even closer to society. I hope that the new image can gracefully and positively enter into the lives of all, and be an even larger influential force."

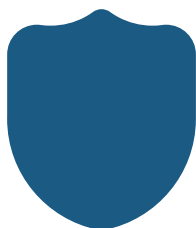
The Symbolism Behind FJCU's New CIS



- 1 **Cross:** a holy symbol of Christ's sacrifice for humanity.
- 2 **Blue and white colors:** reference to the colors of Our Lady of Lourdes.
- 3 **12 stars:** reference to the crown of 12 stars upon the head of the Holy Mother.
- 4 **Shield:** symbolizing a defence of truth and of Church. It also symbolizes the Immaculate Heart of Mary; this is a unique shield without any sharp edges.
- 5 **Olive branches:** symbol of peace, from the Old Testament where doves carried olive branches to Noah's Ark.

As FJCU moves towards the 100th anniversary (2025) since it was founded, the school hopes to progressively revamp not only its website, but also the various applications of all facets. We look forward to relying on this shield motif as an auxiliary system to create noteworthy FJCU-branded design applications, coming up with promotional symbols and creative cultural products. We hope that FJCU's new image will mark a new milestone and spearhead for FJCU's global branding strategy.

FJCU Excellence

Evaluation Results

- FJCU's Department of Food Science became the only university in Taiwan to be recognized by the Institute of Food Technologists in 2020 (effective for 5 years from 2020 to 2025).
- All FJCU academic programs received an accreditation by the Higher Education Evaluation and Accreditation Council of Taiwan (HEEACT) under the HEEACT Program Accreditation in 2020.
- FJCU's Center for Teacher Education received an accreditation by HEEACT's Teacher Education Evaluation in 2020.
- FJCU's Department of Child and Family Studies received an accreditation by HEEACT's Preschool Educare Giver Evaluation in 2020.
- FJCU was accredited by HEEACT's Second Cycle of Institutional Accreditation based on governance and management, resources and support systems, institutional effectiveness, and self-improvement and sustainability in 2018.
- FJCU's Department of Restaurant, Hotel, and Institutional Management became the first university in Asia to be accredited by the Accreditation Commission for Programs in Hospitality Administration in 2018 (effective for 7 years from 2018 to 2025).
- FJCU's Department of Computer Science and Information Engineering and Department of Electrical Engineering received an accreditation by the Institute of Engineering Education Taiwan in 2018.
- FJCU's School of Medicine received an accreditation by the Taiwan Medical Accreditation Council in 2017.
- FJCU's College of Management received accreditation by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB) in 2005, becoming the first university in Taiwan to be so recognized, and subsequently retained its accreditation three times as of 2020.



Academic Research

- Academic research projects (inclusive of MOST projects) number more than 300 each academic year, amounting to more than NT \$200 million in total.
- More than 500 articles are published in important academic journals each year. In 2020, there was a total of 291 first-authorship articles and 263 corresponding-authorship articles, leading all other private universities.
- FJCU is part of the MOST SPARK Project, and is the only anchor university to participate in the SPARK Project via school-level collaboration.



Domestic and International Evaluation Results

- FJCU ranked third among private universities in a 2021 Global Views Monthly University Prestige Survey, with reviewers being university presidents.
- FJCU was voted the university most favoured by employers in the 2021 1111 Job Bank survey, and ranked 5th among all tertiary institutions in Taiwan. In 2020 and 2021, FJCU topped the list for private universities.
- FJCU ranked 168th in the Times Higher Education Asia University Rankings 2021.
- FJCU has ranked in the top 100 schools globally for 2 consecutive years (2020 and 2021) in the QS World University Rankings by Subject for Theology, Divinity & Religious Studies, the only school in Taiwan to do so. FJCU also was on the list for Modern Languages (301-320 globally, 8th in Taiwan) and Medicine (501-550 globally, tied for 9th in Taiwan), ranking among the top 10 schools in Taiwan for these 3 categories, surpassing several public universities.
- FJCU ranked in the top 260 schools in the 2021 QS Asia University Rankings.
- FJCU ranked in the top 800 schools globally in the Times Higher Education World University Rankings 2021.
- FJCU ranked 129th in the THE Emerging Economies University Rankings 2021.

Care for Society and Service Learning

- FJCU was on the THE Impact Rankings query of keywords for each SDG (Sustainable Development Goal), and on the Web of Science database, with a total of 873 articles from FJCU published from 2017 to October 2020 that coincided with the goals stipulated by the 17 SDGs. Moreover, more than 420 modules offered by FJCU are aligned with the educational goals proposed by the SDGs.
- FJCU's first foray into the 2020 Taiwan Corporate Sustainability Awards and the University Social Responsibility Sustainability Project Awards (University) resulted in a silver award for both categories.



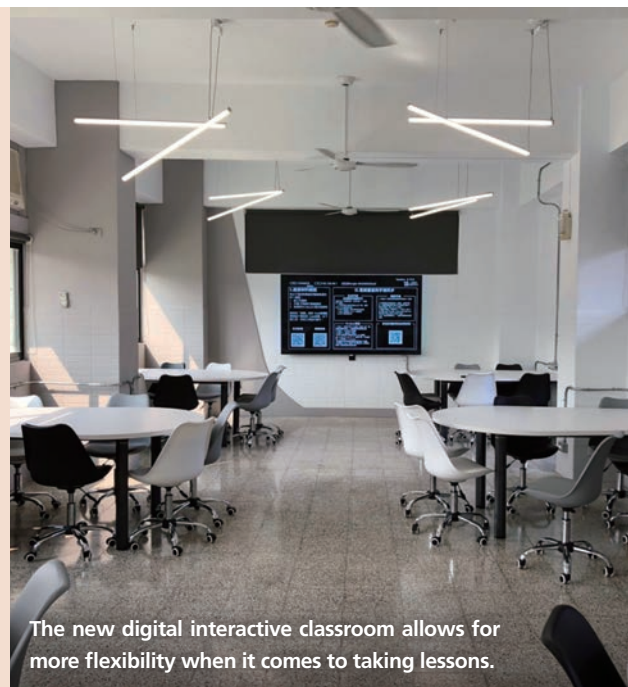
Facilities and Resources

School Resources

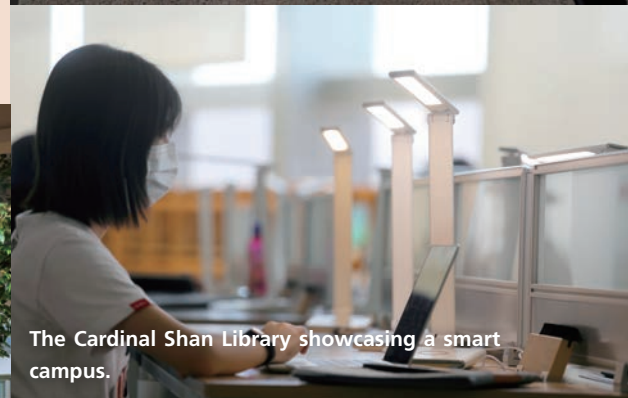
The Center of Information Technology records show that there are 15 computer labs with over 800 computers available on campus, with Wi-Fi coverage available at all education and administrative buildings, the campus food courts, and all public spaces on campus. The university also offers TANet Roaming and Eduroam, giving teachers and students alike the convenience of using their FJCU account to gain access to the Internet at other educational institutes that offer the aforesaid networks as well. All FJCU courses are linked up with the TronClass online learning platform. An online English Self-Learning Center, AIEDL courses and other online resources along with campus software downloads are provided for FJCU teachers and students. In 2020, FJCU established the Interdisciplinary College and the College of Foreign Languages and Literatures Fr. Franz Giet Building among other facilities as enhanced learning spaces. The school also has a School of Professional and Continuing Education, an Indigenous Students Resource Center, a Campus Ministry Center, a Center for the Arts, a Creative Design Center, and a Student Counseling Center and so forth.



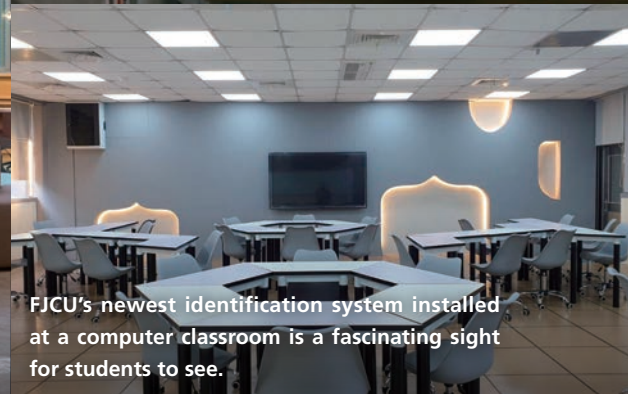

Student Life

FJCU has 7 student dormitories, allowing local and international students as well as teachers to live on campus. The rooms are single, double, 3-person and 4-person, supplied with air-conditionings, study desks, Wi-Fi, wardrobes, individual shower facilities, spin dryers, washing machines (metered service) and other facilities, as well as communal spaces for students to interact with one another. Each dormitory has its own unique facilities. The 2020 newly-constructed Yisheng Dormitory offers an especially attractive living space.

There are 5 food courts on campus, with 3 convenience stores and 2 EZMY cafes, providing both vegetarian and non-vegetarian options. There is also a campus bookstore, an optical shop, and so forth, making campus life convenient for the students.



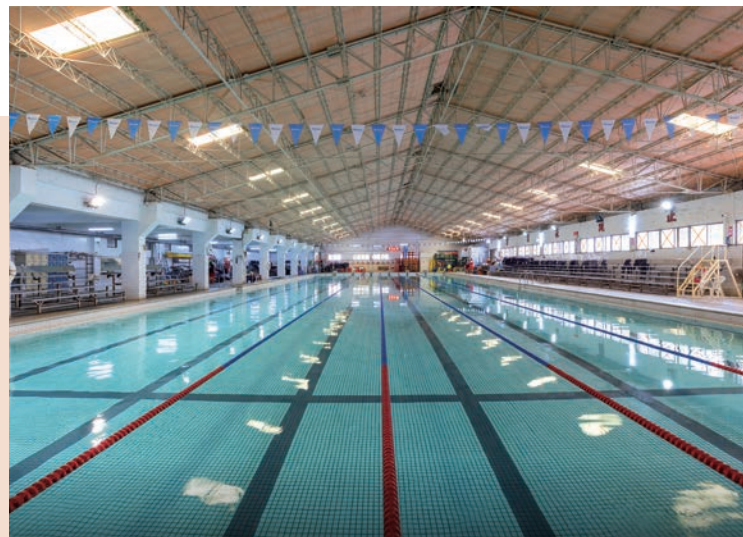

Sports and Athletics

FJCU has its own Guizi Sports Center, with a FIFA-approved artificial turf, basketball courts, volleyball courts, badminton courts, an indoor swimming pool, table tennis courts, a sports injury infirmary, a rhythmic center, a judo training hall, a gymnastics center, and a fitness center among other facilities, allowing teachers and students to enjoy a healthy lifestyle.



Educational Facilities

FJCU has the following libraries: the Fahy library, the Kungpo library, as well as the Cardinal Shan library, with over 1 million books, along with hardcopy journals, electronic journals, e-books, an E-Resources database, and audiovisual resources among other resources. There are also learning spaces provided for students in the form of group study areas, personal study rooms, writing centers, a learning commons, a video-recording room, a multimedia production room and so forth. In recent years, the library has greatly enhanced the digital learning framework, providing rich resources for online self-learning courses, while also actively promoting the use of our library resources. The library is also part of library communities such as RapidILL and NDDS, and has collaborations with libraries from other schools and academic institutions, in turn offering convenient service via these collaborations.



Internationalization



Sister Universities All Over the Globe

FJCU has 435 sister universities globally and signed exchange student agreements with over half of these universities. Each year, nearly 300 international students – from Europe, Americas, Asia, and the Pacific region – come to FJCU for their exchange program. Local FJCU students have an array of options for their own exchange programs with our sister schools. To date, FJCU has signed a total of 31 dual-degree programs with other schools from the major continents.

Maintaining Close Relations with ACUCA & ASEACCU

FJCU maintains close relations with the Association of Christian Universities and Colleges (ACUCA) as well as the Association of Southeast and East Asian Catholic Colleges and Universities (ASEACCU), and encourages students and teachers to participate in annual activities by these two organizations.

Effective Dual-Degree Programs

FJCU signed a total of 31 dual-degree programs with universities from all over the world, including with the University of Bayreuth, the University of Louvain, Temple University, the Catholic University of America, Georgetown University, Oklahoma State University, Renmin University of China, Iowa State University, Widya Mandala Catholic University, Queensland University of Technology, University of Ramon Llull, Sungkyunkwan University, and so forth.

Excellence in Mandarin Education

FJCU's Center of Chinese Language and Culture was established in 1964, and is the second-oldest institution of its kind in Taiwan. It is recognized by the Ministry of Education as an institute of excellence vis-à-vis Mandarin education. The Center teaches around 950 students each year, and has a small-sized classes of 4-7 students so as to maintain excellence in teaching, the results of which are reflected in the student's outstanding learning efficacy. Besides one-to-one classes and special professional courses, each year, during the summer/winter holidays, the Center

hosts student groups from universities all over Taiwan who come to FJCU to learn from its stellar practices. The Center has adopted a two-pronged approach, teaching both Hanyu Pinyin and Bopomofo as well as Simplified and Traditional Chinese concurrently, and utilizes teaching materials in both forms. The Center places equal emphasis on listening, speaking, reading, and writing, so that all facets of Mandarin proficiency are sufficiently dealt with, in turn raising the language capabilities for the students across the board.

The Center grounds itself on the Catholic spirit of education and its established heritage, offering professional assistance to students who encounter issues related to cultural differences and life in Taiwan.

Our Excellent Track Record in Guiding Our International Students

FJCU has consistently received recognition from the Ministry of Education for excellence in guiding its international students, as well as for its outstanding and experience staff. Both the Overseas Student Office and the International Student Center offer a variety of scholarships, and there are also life counseling, many cultural exchange activities, clubs, and societies gatherings. FJCU also offers free Mandarin classes, allowing international students to have an enriching experience and a sense of belonging during their time here.

Fu Jen Global

The Fu Jen Global is a key emphasis in FJCU's efforts vis-à-vis internationalization. It will offer all-English degree programs in the future that attract students and will be a competitive advantage on the international stage. It will also collaborate with the school's EU Center and India Center as well as other programs to offer interdisciplinary modules and courses.

Clubs and Societies

FJCU adopts a holistic approach to education, and encourages all students to learn beyond the classroom. The assortment of student-led clubs and societies at all levels has become an area for FJCU students to explore their interests, make lifelong friends, and establish a network of collaborations to attain their goals. Under the guidance and direction of supervising teachers, extracurricular activities are an important stage for self-learning.

Student clubs and societies are categorized in 6 major fields: academic, recreational, service, physical fitness, arts, and music. The total number of such associations number more than 100, along with around 80 student-led organizations at the university, college, and department level. There are 12 college student associations and 50 department student associations, as well as the School of Continuing Education student association along with 18 SOCE department student associations.

Through these student associations, FJCU students have the opportunity to organize events, work together with their peers from the department and also meet with peers of similar interest to learn a diverse range of extracurricular skills and professional knowledge. The chance to interact with other students from all walks of life, learning to communicate and collaborate with one another, and leveraging on the strengths of each person, allows students to attain the goal of showcasing their talents on a stage that is compatible with their capabilities.

Service Learning Center; FJCU Love from the Heart

In order to develop students with diverse capabilities and a spirit of human-centered care and concern, FJCU integrates professional courses with service learning opportunities. Students see the needs of others, and in turn reflect upon their core values. The Service Learning Center integrates resources and volunteer mentorship, encouraging students to join service learning volunteer teams and receive basic volunteer training as well as specialized training, which they are then able to use to apply for a volunteer service record or self-learning credits (service learning category). The 30 volunteer service-learning teams in FJCU cover areas such as care for the underprivileged, extracurricular counseling, cultural exchange, Chinese language teaching and hygiene promotion, across places such as Taiwan, India, Mongolia, Vietnam, Myanmar, Cambodia, Philippines, Tanzania, Burkina Faso, Ghana, and so forth. Students get a chance to experience local life, attempt bilateral communication and learn about multiculturalism, showing civic-mindedness and carrying out their social responsibility by leveraging their professional skills to take action by showing care and concern.

Increasing International Competitiveness through Exchange with International Students

FJCU encourages students to go abroad and learn through exchanges with the international community so as to broaden their horizons. On top of several projects funded by the Ministry of Education, FJCU also set up a scholarship fund for study at our sister universities and an overseas internship fund among other initiatives. From 2018 to 2020, a total of 1,014 FJCU students went to our sister universities for exchange, and 513 students received funding from FJCU for their exchange while 27 students received sponsorship for their overseas internships (statistics as of April 2021).

Participation in External Events

FJCU encourages students to participate in external competitions, events, conferences and so forth so as to learn and interact with students from other institutions.

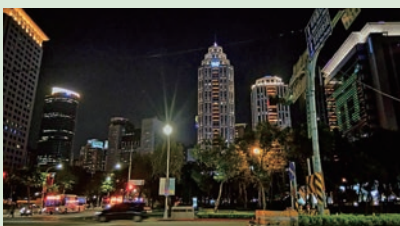

COLLEGE OF LIBERAL ARTS

Introduction

Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU) was established in Beijing in 1925 and its College of Liberal Arts was comprised of three departments: Department of Chinese Language, Department of History, and Department of Philosophy. FJCU was re-established in Taipei in 1961 and first set up an Institute of Philosophy. FJCU was then moved to its present site in Xinzhuang in 1963. The Department of Chinese Literature, Department of History and Department Philosophy are under the management of the College of Liberal Arts. In response to social changes and the trend of revitalizing the professional fields of study, since 2010, each department offers Bachelor's, Master's and/or Doctoral programs for studying applied Chinese Literature, Applied History, and Philosophical Consulting. The Department of Chinese Literature also plans to offer an interdisciplinary curriculum to provide students with diversified learning opportunities.

Introduction

The College of Arts focuses on three major fields: performing arts (Department of Music), visual arts (Department of Applied Arts), and environmental art (Department of Landscape Architecture). It is a complete and high-quality learning situation with teachers having in-depth academic training and practical experience.

Mission and Educational Goals

With the philosophy of holistic education as its aim, the College of Arts emphasizes the teaching and research of its specialties, enhances their practical application, strengthens the productive integration of science, technology and humanities, and encourages innovation and the development of new thinking.

Academic Features

The Department of Landscape Architecture pays special attention to dialectical presentation and thinking of different values in the process of planning and design development. The areas of specialty of the teachers in this department cover all levels in the field of landscape architecture, which not only provides students with abundant knowledge and experience, but also provides a variety of communication channels with Mainland China and foreign countries, thus providing students with opportunities to learn interdisciplinary knowledge.

The Department of Music focuses on training performance talent. With new equipment, a strong faculty and complete curriculum planning, it trains professional musicians to have

great accomplishments, thus making the department a garden that glorifies the Lord.

The Department of Applied Arts is divided into visual communication, computer communication, metalworking products, and interior design groups. The curriculum for the visual communication group includes graphic design, computer-aided design, packaging design, brand strategy and image identification design, commercial film production, advertising and related applications. The curriculum for the computer animation group is supplemented by courses related to digital multimedia. VR, AR and other related material are added to some courses.

The curriculum for the metalworking products group includes metalworking, jewelry presentation techniques, metalworking special research, metal product creation, gemology, practical metalworking modeling appreciation, metalworking graduation production, and so on.

The cultural and creative curriculum cultivates talents of interdisciplinary cultural and creative industries, trains local

creative and cultural tourism talents, and strengthens students' practical and industrial management abilities, thus seamlessly connecting with the cultural and creative industries.

The curriculum of interior design group takes the concept and creation of space design of interior design as the main axis of curriculum planning, and through the discussion of different steps of design development and the actual operation of construction drawings, it trains students to experience the aesthetic feeling of space and observe the living environment, and then implement it into the design.

Academic Resources

There are various design studios, study spaces, drawing classrooms, display cabinets and metalworking classrooms available for all years in our college. The College of Arts has a "Huairen Hall" which can accommodate 200 people and a "Huaide Hall" which can accommodate 150 people. Besides, it has 60 classrooms and piano rooms for practice. Additionally, it has professional hall facilities such as an orchestra practice room, a percussion practice room, a choral classroom, a comprehensive

chamber music classroom, an electronic music classroom and a comprehensive classroom. It also has professional halls and rooms with software and hardware equipment and facilities, which are of first-class international level.

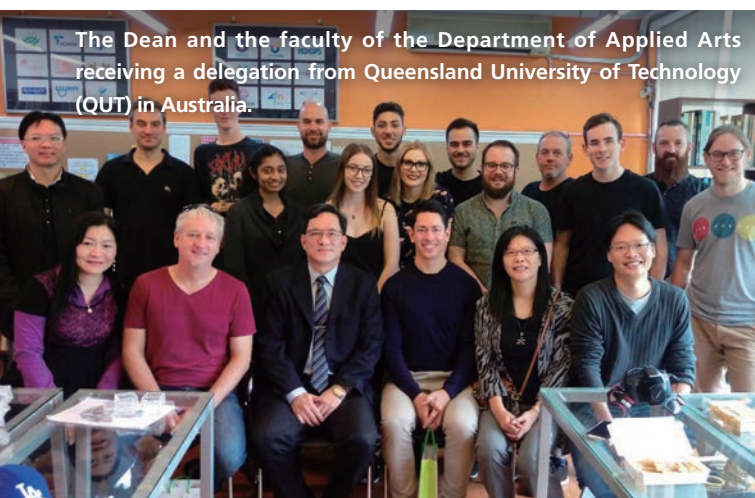

The College of Communication was established in 2010, which is comprised of the Graduate Institute of Mass Communication, the Department of Communication Arts, the Department of Journalism and Communication Studies, the Department of Advertising and Public Relations, the Bachelor's Degree Program of Mass Communication, the Media and Instructional Resources Center, and the Voice of FJCU Radio Station.

Academic Features

Our curriculums are planned aiming to emphasize the balanced development of theory and practice, to educate students to have a spirit of social care and service learning, and to attach importance to students' participation in international activities and the expansion of their international vision.

Faculty and Staff

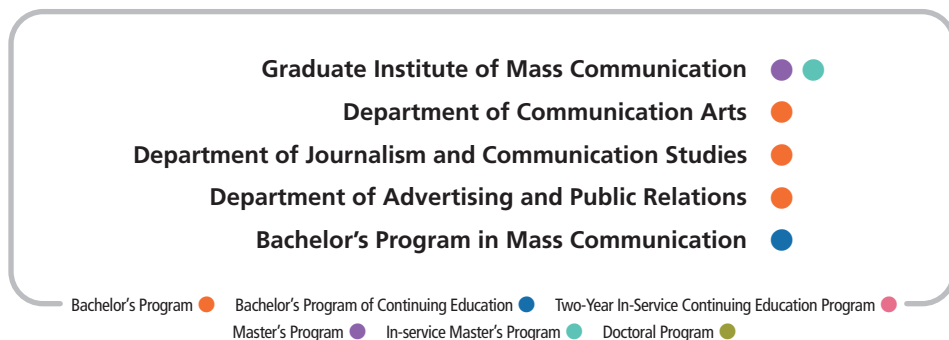
The College of Communication has a strong faculty lineup, with 28 full-time teachers, all of them have doctorates from well-known universities at home and abroad. In addition,

more than 40 middle and high-level supervisors of domestic communication industry/enterprises are recruited as part-time teachers to teach various practical courses.

Outstanding Performance

1. The Graduate Institute of Mass Communication has signed a master's double degree agreement with the Lew Klein College of Media & Communication, Temple University in USA to acknowledge academic credits from one another and is the first graduate institute of mass communication in Taiwan offering students the possibility of an international master's degree.
2. The alumni of the College of Communication are short-listed and frequent winners of the three major annual awards presented in Taiwan, along with the Golden Melody Awards for music and the Golden Horse Film Festival and Awards for movies and films. For example, Mr. Lin, Jun-Yang won the Golden Bell TV Award for Best Director in the film of "The Distance Between Us And Evil;" Mr. Chen, Wei-Hao, director and screenwriter, won the Golden Horse Award for Best Short Drama Film "Death of an Insurance Salesman;" and Huang Yi-Xin, the hostess of the TV program "Walking Around The World With Bigfoot," won the Golden Bell Radio Award for her children's program hosted for three consecutive years.
3. Mr. Gong Da-Zhong, Chief Creative Officer of Ogilvy & Mather Taiwan led the team to win the highest honor of THE

ONE SHOW public relations gold award sponsored by Fareast Telecomm Campaign, which was the first Golden Pencil won by the advertising industry in Taiwan. Mr. Xiang Zhen, who serves Sanli TV Station, won the Outstanding News Award-International News Award for TV and Internet (Audio and Video) Programs.

4. In recent years, the students in our College have been recognized for outstanding performances: for example, the works of students in the Department of Communication Arts have been broadcasted in a drama exhibition on public TV. Journalism students have won numerous awards in journalism, such as the PeoPo Citizen Journalism Award of Public Television and the Global Chinese Sustainable Reporting Award. Advertising students often take part in the Golden Sentence Award of Advertising Catchwords and have won the top three places nationally; they also won first place in the Chinese Public Relations Award and have represented Taiwan to participate in AD STARS at the Busan International Advertising Festival in South Korea.

COLLEGE OF SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING

Introduction

The College of Science and Engineering is made up of six departments: Department of Mathematics, Department of Physics, Department of Chemistry, Department of Life Science, Department of Electrical Engineering and Department of Computer Science and Information Engineering (each offers a bachelor's program and a master's program). We offer a Bachelor's Program in Medical Informatics and Innovative Applications and a Bachelor's Program in Artificial Intelligence and Information Security. The Department of Computer Science and Information Engineering offers an In-Service Master's Program and the Department of Chemistry offers a Ph D Program. The College of Science and Engineering has also established a Graduate Institute (which offers a Ph D Program in Interdisciplinary Applied Science and Engineering), an Interdisciplinary Biomedical and Optoelectronic Research Center, and a Software And Network Multimedia Research Center.

Mission and Educational Goals

Our mission is aimed at emphasizing professionalization and internationalization, and our long-term development goal is to cultivate professional scientific and technological talents with a human-centered quality and macro vision.

1. Professionalization: To cooperate with the newly established Fu Jen Catholic University Hospital, and with cross-hospital cooperation to develop precision medicine/health science and technology, which is the key development goal.
2. Internationalization: English-taught specialized courses, international academic cooperation and exchange, and recruitment of outstanding overseas students.

3. Industry-university cooperation: To develop new technology and product innovation, to strengthen students' practical experience through industry-university cooperation, and to improve students' employability.
4. Interdisciplinary science and technology integration: To develop interdisciplinary research teams in medicine and electronic information and biomedicine (biomedical optoelectronics and materials).
5. Human-centered care: To serve society and support disadvantaged groups through the professional knowledge of science and engineering.

- Interdisciplinary learning: In order to cultivate innovative interdisciplinary talents, there are several interdisciplinary micro program courses for the students to choose from, such as the mobile application and digital interactive micro program course, the medical engineering credit course, the science and technology innovation and entrepreneurship credit course, intelligent robot and interactive creative design credit course, the network and multimedia credit course, and the "Internet of Things" (IoT) credit course.

Our college is rich in teaching resources, and there are many important professional instruments and equipment in each department. The New Experimental Building of Science and Engineering will be completed by the end of 2021. Floors five

through seven will be an industry-university space combined with industry, which will be of great help to students' future employment and teachers' cooperation between industry and university. The school will set up an instrument center on the fifth floor, which will become an important interdisciplinary research center of Biology and Chemistry for Fu Jen Catholic University/Fu Jen Hospital in the future.

Faculty and Staff

There are 92 full-time teachers, including 25 professors, 45 associate professors, 20 assistant professors and 2 lecturers. In addition, there are 4 chair professors and 1 honorary professor.

Career Opportunities

Excellent performance in both employment and further studies. Every year, many graduates from our college are admitted to domestic research institutes. At present, our college has more than 20,000 alumni distributed all over the world, and they are highly praised for their academic research, teaching or service to the business sector.

Outstanding Performance

Each teacher has several commissioned implementation plans from the Ministry of Science and Technology and industry-university cooperation, and the entire college receives an average annual subsidy of more than NT \$50 million from outside the school. In recent years, the research results have been fruitful, with about 90 journal papers being produced every year.

A wide array of bachelor's, master's and PhD programs are available. The College of Human Ecology is named for its coverage of food, clothing, housing, travel, education, and recreation, and its English name (College of Human Ecology) highlights this concept to emphasize its commitment to human dignity, family prosperity, and environmental protection.

Mission and Educational Goals

To promote the lifelong health and prosperity of individuals.

Mission:

We are aiming at upholding the ideals of Truth, Kindness, Beauty and Holiness. Teaching, research, service, and initiatives to promote health are combined with innovative technology and ideas of globalization to give students a cross- disciplinary education. 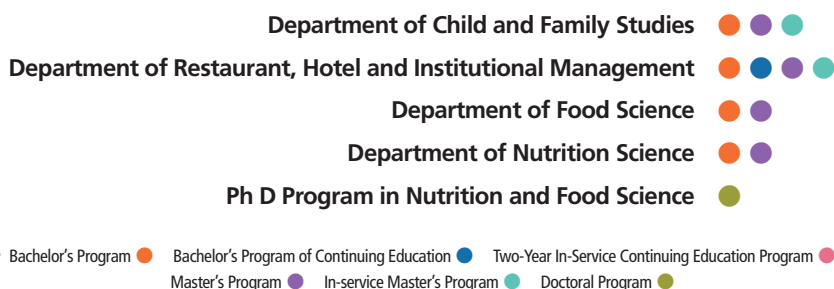

At present it consists of the Department of Textiles and Clothing, the Graduate Institute of Museum Studies and the MA Program in Brand and Fashion Management (with class teaching fully in English).

Adhering to the spirit of Christian fraternity, we are committed to using fashion and textiles to promote human innovation, sustainability and well-being. The educational goal is to cultivate professional talents in textiles, clothing, brands, and museums with internationalization, professionalization and innovation.

Academic Features

Introduction

When Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU) was re-established in Taiwan in 1963, the College of Law was also established and later transformed into a School of Law. At present the School of Law is composed of three departments: Department of Law, Department of Financial and Economic Law, and Graduate Department of Law. It also has a Legal Service Center and publishes *Fu Jen Law Review*. It is a high-quality professional law college with a most complete learning system and community integration.

Mission and Educational Goals

The School of Law of Fu Jen Catholic University is a pivotal center of law in Taiwan. In addition to cultivating students' legal knowledge, it also cultivates legal talents with equal emphasis on both knowledge and specialty. Also emphasized are the development of moral and academic qualities through various educational methods such as holistic education, legal ethics, service learning, and cooperation between industry and university. At the same time, the School emphasizes the promotion of foreign language ability, broadens the macro-international vision, promotes a plan of fostering elites, and contributes to the country by combining theory and practice. In order to train legal talents in the new era, our School will continue to develop professionalization, humanization, integration, and internationalization.

Outstanding performance

Under the leadership of teachers with academic and practical

experience, students have performed very well in recent years in the intercollegiate debates of the "Lee and Li Foundation Cup," the "Philip C. Jessup International Law Moot Court Competition (JESSUP)," and the "PwC Tax Moot Court Competition." In addition, our School has implemented the intensive national examination program, and its departments have fully assisted students in preparing for participation in the national examinations, organized lectures and supplementary courses, and rewarded students who have outstanding achievements. This year our students have performed quite brilliantly in national examinations for lawyers, judges and magistrates.

Academic Features

1. Learning passport

From the beginning of the freshman year, students work hard to meet the graduation threshold of their own learning passport. In this way, they cultivate an attitude of independent learning, and even lifelong learning, and work towards becoming a legal person who can discover self, respect life, and care about society.

2. Internship court

Our School has set up an internship court for students to put their knowledge and experience into practice, and each department will conduct mock trial activities every year, so that students can be closer to the legal operation in practice.

3. Legal services

Our School has a legal service center with full-time teaching assistants to answer telephone calls and written inquiries from the public, and to help students set up a Fu Jen University Legal Service Team to publicize legal knowledge in nearby primary and secondary schools, and to handle legal education

activities in primary and secondary schools and communities. In recent years, it has cooperated with medical schools to jointly promote medical and legal services in the remote rural areas of Taitung County.

4. Internship visit

In cooperation with the New Taipei District Court, our School selects students for court practice, and cooperates with the Judges Academy to set up practice courses. During the course, visits to the court, the Taiwan Stock Museum, the Taiwan Depository & Clearing Corporation and other relevant units are arranged.

Future Prospects

1. Professional Refinement and Integration

Besides focusing on the professional education relate to the basic theory of law, we will continue to develop the field of

financial and economic law and try to integrate the emerging laws with the basic theory of law.

2. Professional Ethics and Holistic Education

We will attach importance to legal ethics and emphasize the maintenance of human rights and the practice of fairness and justice. More efforts will be made to promote the concept of human rights and strengthen the study of legal services, so as to implement the education of an all-round personality devoted to care for the society and serving the people.

3. International Outlook

In order to cultivate legal talent with a global vision, we will promote curriculum maps with law courses taught in English, and encourage students to engage in international exchange experiences along with a multi-dimensional learning activities in our college.

The College of Social Sciences is made up of the abovementioned five departments, a bachelor's program, a master's program and an International Center. The scope of teaching and research include all major areas of social sciences. Teachers have outstanding performance in research and teaching, aiming to cultivate talents with professional ability, social insight, human-centered care and social service for the society.

Mission and Educational Goals

Department of Social Work:

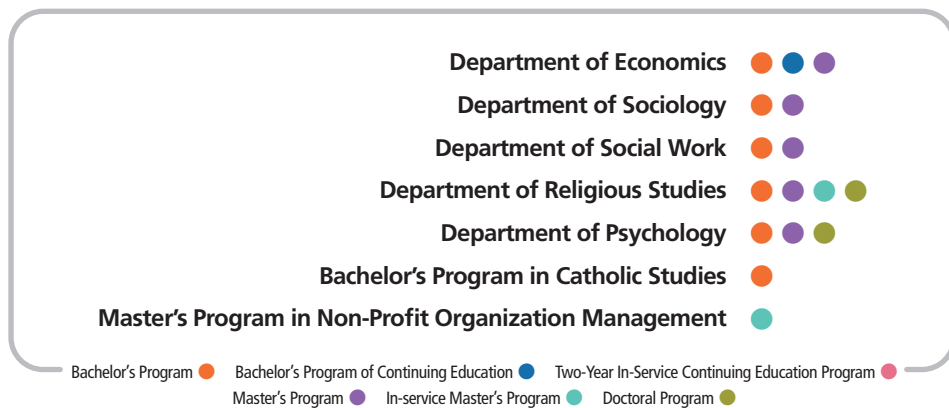

Department of Psychology:

Bachelor's Program in Catholic Studies:

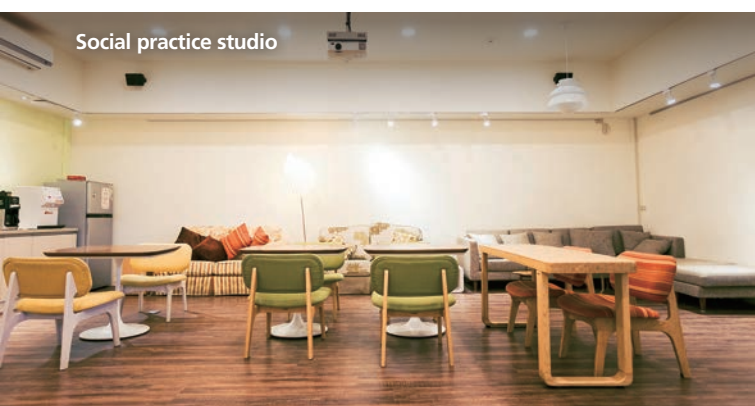

The School of Continuing Education (SOCE), formerly known as the Evening School of the Fu Jen Catholic University (FJCU), was established in 1969, and was changed from the Evening School to the School of Continuing Education in 1997. In response to the diversified development of FJCU, it provides a lifelong learning environment and nurtures many talents for society and the nation.

As for professional training, we stress students' extensive knowledge and advanced professional ability, and cultivate students with a human-centered quality, humane feelings, skill in interpersonal communication, and ideological judgment under the professional training of various departments and courses.

Mission and Educational Goals

The School of Continuing Education is committed to the holistic education philosophy espoused by FJCU. We take holistic education as our goal, to follow the school motto of Truth, Kindness, Beauty and Holiness, to promote the all-round personality of students physically, mentally and spiritually, and to nurture many talents for society and the country.

In addition to training students to have extensive knowledge and sophisticated professional ability so as to enter the society with professional ability to specialize in work, students are also trained to be social people with human-centered qualities, scientific and technological thinking, humane feelings, skill in interpersonal communication and an international dimension.

Features of the School of Continuing Education

1. The Bachelor's Certificate is the same as that of day school students.

be exchange students in sister schools. They can also apply for the bachelor's programs sponsored by other colleges.

- Besides participating in any of the clubs, groups, or societies sponsored by SOCE which have their special characteristics, they can also participate in activities organized for the entire university that make use of the university's resources.
- The special mentoring system provides guidance and assistance to students in daily life. A complete student counseling area is planned, and the "Christian Counseling Centers," the "Student Counseling Center," and the "Mentor Supervision Office" are situated adjacent to each other to provide a special area for students' physical, mental and spiritual counseling.

Academic Features

The School of Continuing Education of FJCU covers a variety of departments and courses, and integrates interdisciplinary expertise.

Regarding curriculum planning, both theory and practice are emphasized. Besides basic theory courses, practical courses are also offered, and teachers are invited to give lectures, so

that students can understand the combination of theory and practical experience to meet the actual needs of young people in the working society.

Starting from the school year 2020, courses of micro-learning have been offered to students. Those students who have completed the required grades will be awarded a certificate upon completion of study.

The Holistic Education Center (HEC) was formerly known as a department affiliated to the Academic Affairs Office of Fu Jen Catholic University which offers common courses to students. The HEC was formally established in 2000 as a college-level unit and is responsible for assisting the FJCU in planning and implementing the holistic education curriculum. All undergraduate students must complete 32 credits of holistic education curriculum prior to graduation.

Holistic Education Curriculums

The goal of the holistic education curriculum offered by the HEC is to provide students with a broad knowledge and the skills (especially in critical thinking) necessary to be active citizens and educated participants in society. In short, we want to help students realize their potential physically, mentally, and spiritually.

The holistic education curriculum is divided into three main categories: Core Curriculum, Fundamental Curriculum, and General Curriculum.

Core Curriculum: to establish a complete value system for students, thereby cultivating a sound personality and high-quality citizenship.

Fundamental Curriculum: to develop a foundation for the students' lifelong learning and enhance their ability to participate in society.

General Curriculum: to cultivate students' broad knowledge, humane temperament, aesthetic appreciation, care for society and respect for nature.

Scope of study of the above three major curriculums:

1. Core Curriculum: Introduction to university life, philosophy of life, professional ethics and physical education.
2. Fundamental Curriculum: Chinese, foreign languages, and

information literacy (the ability to find, evaluate, organize, use, and communicate information in all its various formats, most notably in situations requiring decision making, problem solving, or the acquisition of knowledge).

3. General Curriculum: Humanities and arts, nature and technology, and social sciences.

Excellent Leadership Micro Courses

In order to follow up efforts made by all countries to cultivate international talents and demonstrate the social responsibility of Catholic universities, Dr. Vincent Han-Sun Chiang, President of the FJCU, assigned the HEC to offer the "Excellent Leadership Micro Course" in 2018, which is the first course of training high-quality leaders from all walks of life, so that FJCU students with good English communication skills can gain the knowledge and skills necessary for future careers through high-quality courses, master lectures and overseas services, and have an international vision and perspective, critical thinking ability, cross-cultural communication skills and high-quality citizenship, and thereby contribute to society and the nation.

The "Excellent Leadership Micro Course" is exclusively provided by the HEC, offering six programs in all: "Globalization Issues," "Quality Leadership," "Fu Jen Justice Lectures," "Eastern and Western Classics," "Professional English Conversation," and "Demonstration of Practical Applications for Professional English Language Learning," among which three are fully English-taught programs. At the same time, "Program Tutors" and the "Academic Tutors" are available to help students successfully complete their programs. In addition, in order to improve effective leadership skills and competitiveness, students are recommended to attend the summer leadership training camp held by the University of Texas at Dallas every year and to participate in the international volunteer service study in winter and summer vacations, in order to broaden their international vision, cultivate human-centered care and strengthen themselves for future challenges

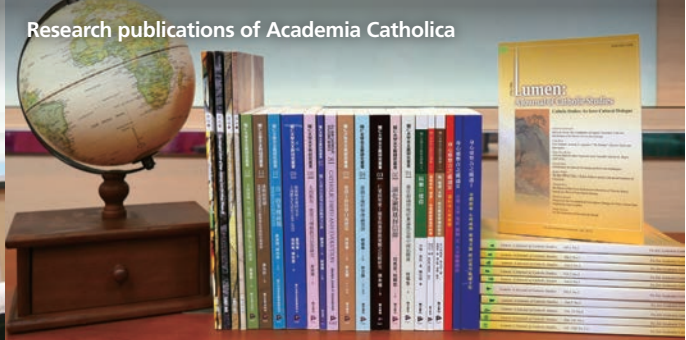

Fu Jen Catholica Academia was founded in August 2008 as a graduate research institute by integrating five academic research centers: Institute of Scholastic Philosophy, Institutem Historiae Ecclesiae, Center for the Study of Science and Religion, Sinological Research Center Monumenta Serica, and John Paul II Institute for Research into Dialogue for Peace. Academia Catholica emphasizes the Catholic character of FJCU by promoting interdisciplinary dialogue between reason and faith and encouraging cultural and intellectual exchange between the East and the West through international academic exchange.

Features

The research focus of Fu Jen Academia Catholica includes Science and Religion, Scholastic Philosophy, History of Catholicism, Sinology, Literature, Peace and Justice, Moral Philosophy, Aesthetics and other interdisciplinary studies. In the future, the institute hopes to expand to other related fields such as Law, Society, Counseling and Education.

Information on the Five Research Centers INSTITUTE OF SCHOLASTIC PHILOSOPHY

The Institute of Scholastic Philosophy was subsidized by the Ministry of Education and founded by the Department of Philosophy in 1990. It was named by President Lokuang the following year as the Institute of Scholastic Philosophy. Eight years later, the institute was officially transferred to the College of Liberal Arts and was merged with Academia Catholica in 2008. This institute is committed to cultivating research and intellectual exchange for the integration of Scholastic Philosophy and Chinese culture. The institute aims to strengthen Fu Jen's philosophical character and promote its goals and Catholic spirit.

Institutem Historiae Ecclesiae

The Institutem Historiae Ecclesiae focuses on research on the history of the Catholic Church, especially in Greater China. Apart from research projects, this institute also collects historical materials, promotes research publications and organizes academic conferences. It also actively collaborates with relevant national and international organizations.

Center for the Study of Science and Religion

This Center was founded in 2001, and was under the College of Science and Engineering. The Center strives to combine religious, philosophic, scientific and human resources to advance studies in Science and Religion. The Center merged with Academia Catholica in 2008. Its purpose is to provide a platform for research in Religion and Science in the context of Taiwan and Chinese cultures. The Center is dedicated to advances in Theology, Religion, Literature, Social Science, and Natural Science.

Monumenta Serica Sinological Research Center

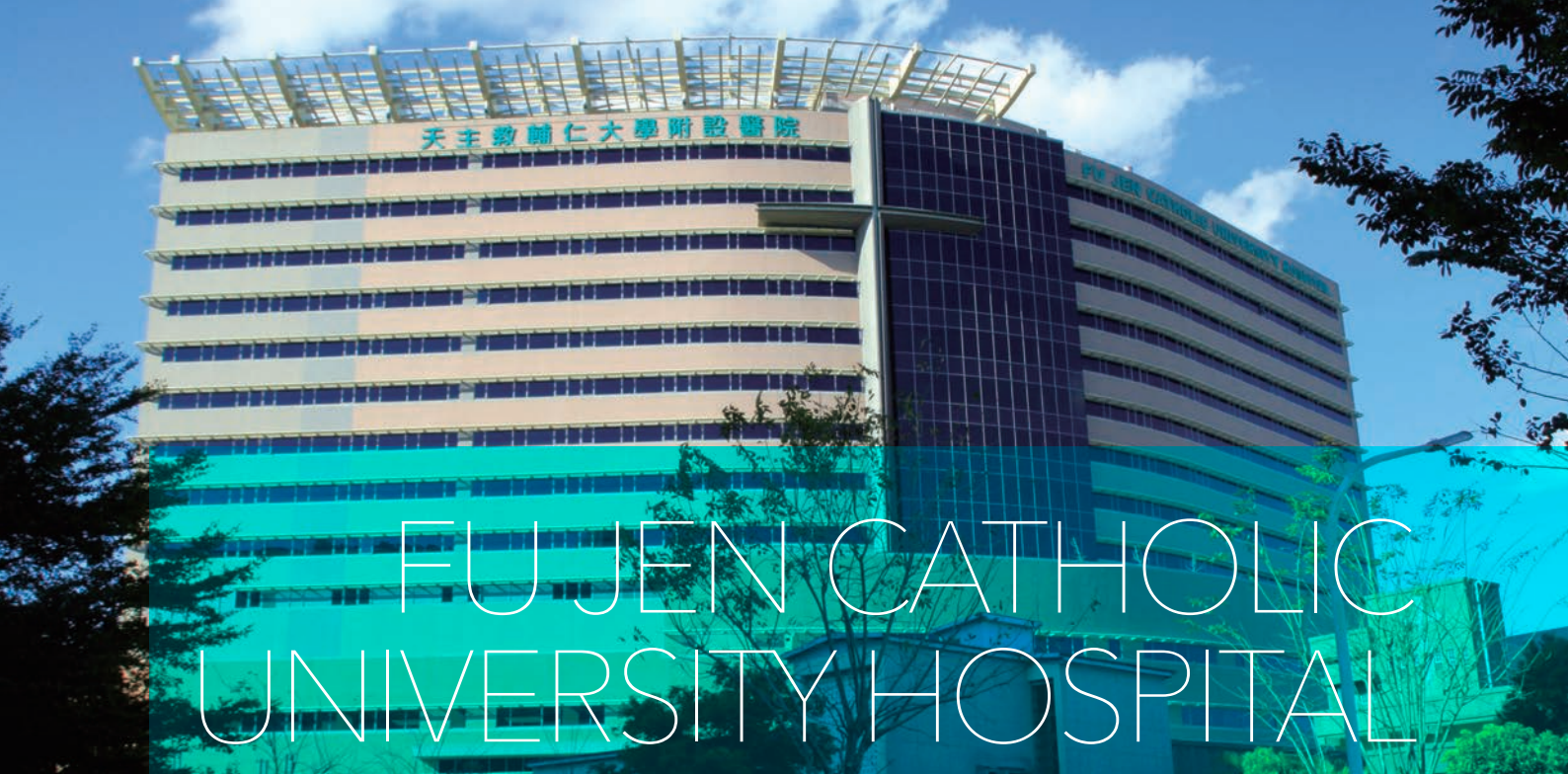
This Center acts as a bridge between SVD Monumenta Serica Sinological Research Center in St. Augustine, Germany and FJCU in their efforts at research on Chinese culture.

John Paul II Institute for Research into Dialogue for Peace

This Institute was established in August, 1997 and then merged with Academia Catholica in 2008. It endeavors to advance the cause of world peace from the perspective of Chinese culture and Catholicism.

Future Prospects

Through the efforts of Fu Jen Academia Catholica, FJCU hopes to be a leader in Chinese Catholic research by transmitting the Gospel values and the teachings of the Church through its academic research and thus enable FJCU to be an intellectual center for Chinese Catholicism.



FJCU established its College of Medicine in 1990, and in 2000 the School of Medicine was set up. With the establishment of the College of Medicine, plans were made to build a hospital. Moreover, the districts of Xinzhuang, Taishan, Wugu, and Shulin where FJCU is located, with over a million residents lacked an acute care hospital. As location and time are key factors in treating acute illnesses, on top of the fact that the government increased funds for New Taipei City's medical resources, an opportunity to establish a large-scale hospital was presented.

Encouraged by Cardinal Paul Shan Kuo-his and with the efforts of FJCU presidents Prof. Bernard Li and Prof. Chiang Han-sun along with support from the Church, FJCU alumni, and society, the FJCU Hospital began construction in 2013 and was officially opened on 29th September 2017 and strives to be a top-notch hospital. Dr. Wang Shoei-shen, the leading authority on cardiovascular surgery, became the inaugural superintendent of the FJCU Hospital.

Facilities

The hospital compound is 17,876 square meters, and total floor area is 111,448 square meters. There are 4 basement levels and 15 floors. The architectural height is 79 meters.

There are roughly 1,000 hospital beds, with 499 beds allocated for emergency and regular use for ad-hoc purposes. The standard for beds allocated for emergency and regular use for ad-hoc purposes is 99 beds, and 37 beds for special illnesses. Currently the number of beds for FJCU Hospital stands at 499 and 167 respectively.

The operating cost is around NT \$6.7 billion, with a loan of NT \$42 billion and funds raised at over NT \$1 billion. The cost of medical equipment is roughly NT \$800 million. FJCU Hospital regulations stipulate that 10% of profit should be diverted back to FJCU for academic and research purposes.

There are approximately 1,400 medical and administrative staff employed at FJCU Hospital.

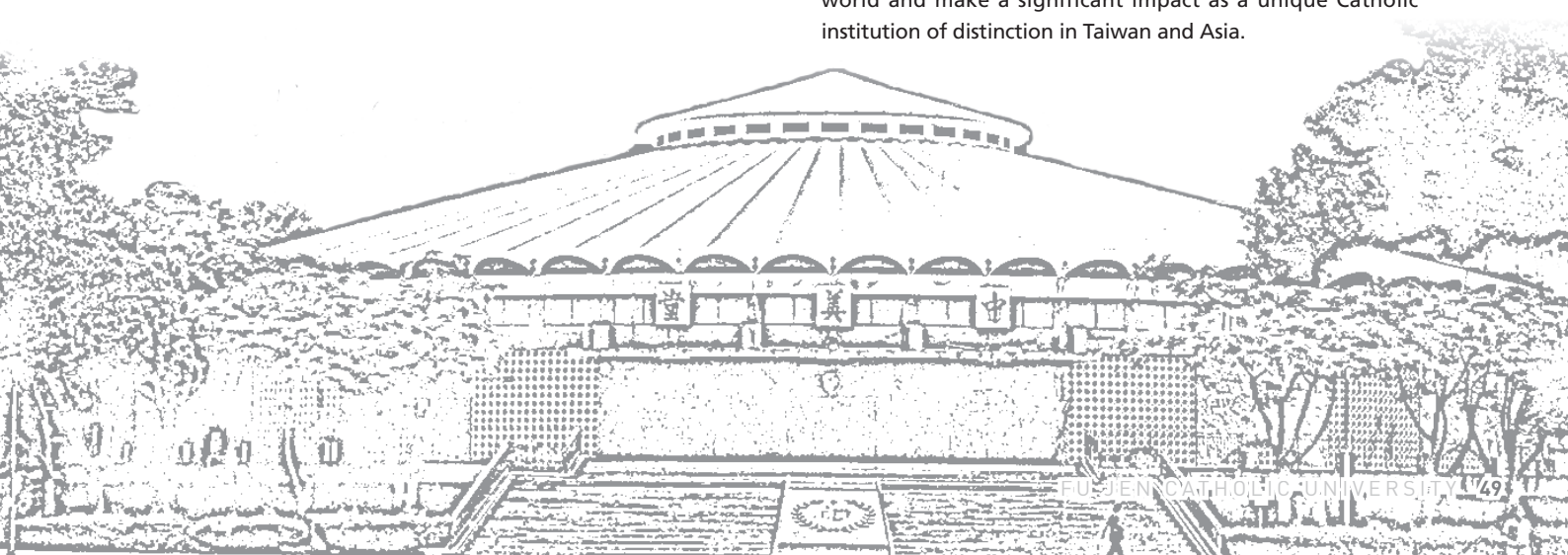
FU JEN UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION

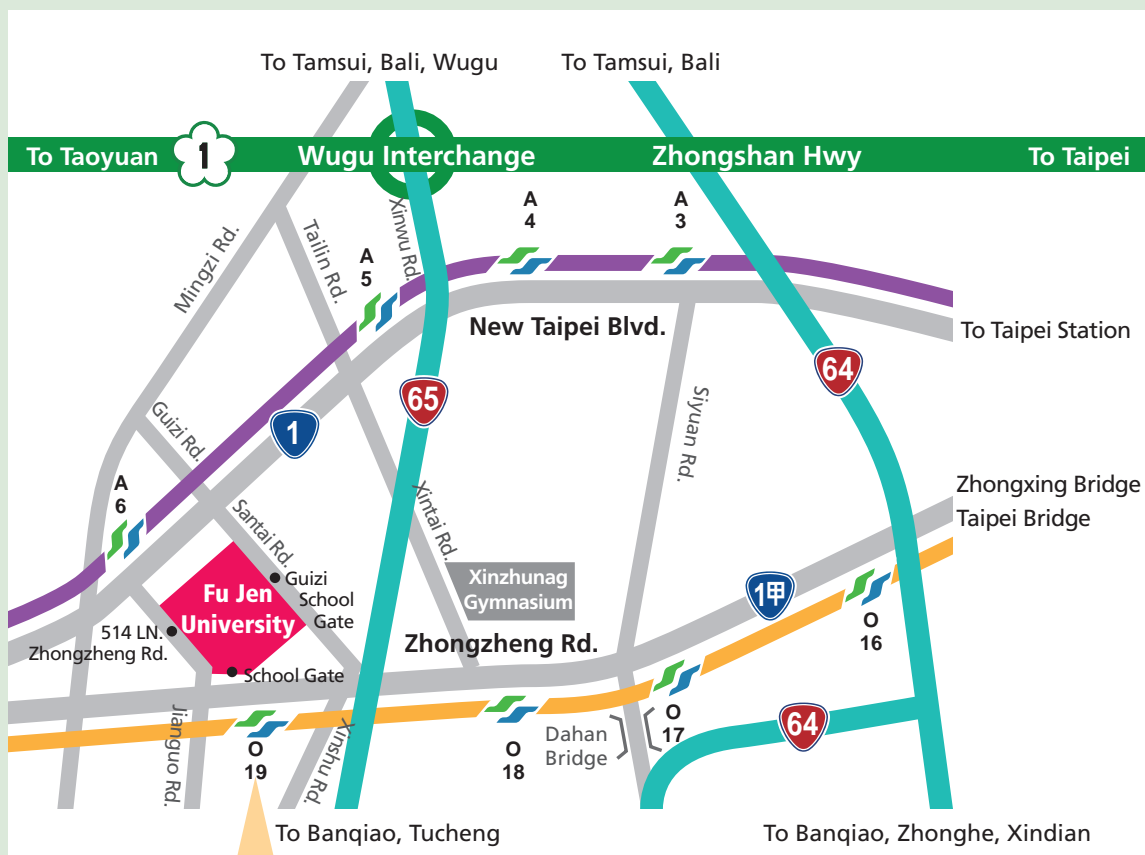

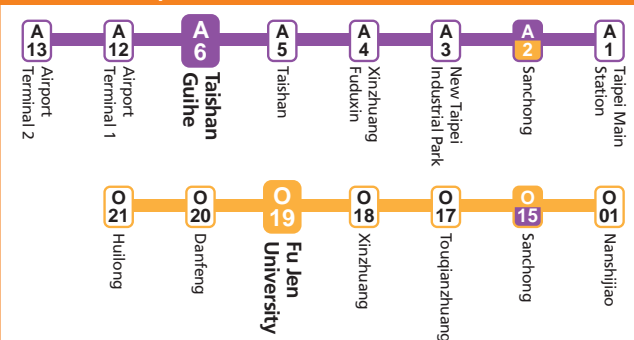
